Inspired to paint the native pastoral nomadic people of northern Kenya by her visit there with her family in 2006, artist Nancy Howe began creating a cultural series of paintings to raise funding to support small business development for the women of these pastoral communities living in extreme poverty. “Painting a Brighter Future for Women” project was launched, whereby donations from the sale her original artwork of these people benefited an innovative and highly successful microfinance program, that helped these women to generate sustainable income to support their families and contribute to their communities.

Since then, the project has expanded to include other areas of the world and will continue to support varied programs benefiting women. In 2011 a cultural series of the people of Bhutan was initiated where donations contribute to a women’s solar engineers program and home construction in remote villages, and in 2012 she began a series of paintings of the Kuna indigenous people of Panama to benefit a marine resource environmental training program for Kuna women. Her commitment is to have a lasting positive effect on the lives of these women and to communicate the dignity, value, resilience, and diversity of their cultures.

John Michael Carter is one of America's best known impressionists, whose work is admired by his collectors and respected by his peers. He studied at the American Academy of Art in Chicago and earned a BFA from the Art Center College of Design in Los Angeles.

His portrait commissions have included several state senators, governors, and Supreme Court justices, and many other civic, academic and corporate leaders.
