The Hispanic Society of America was founded in 1904 by Archer Milton Huntington as a "free public library, museum and educational institution, containing objects of artistic, historic, and literary interest," for the purposes of the "advancement of the study of the Spanish and Portuguese languages, literature, and history, and advancement of the study of the countries wherein Spanish and Portuguese are or have been spoken languages."
