In this first of two painting sessions, Daud Akhriev OPAM will demonstrate how he approaches the construction of a composition and sets himself up for a long-term composition. He'll talk about how he maximizes the positive and negative space to create interest. Finally, he will develop the major lights and darks, and begin to lay in forms. He will continue to develop the painting so in Session Two on Friday morning, he can show attendees how he moved the composition forward.

Daud Akhriev OPAM studied classical painting and drawing for 14 years, graduating with honors from the Repin Institute (Russian Academy of Fine Art) in 1991. His paintings and drawings have won numerous awards with Art Renewal Center, *Plein Air* Magazine, *Pastel Journal, Artists* Magazine, *Salon International* and, of course, Oil Painters of America. Akhriev is internationally sought after as an instructor for figure and landscape painting, and for his monumental work including The Four Seasons, four 9-foot bronze figures completed for the city of Chattanooga and listed on the national Public Art Registry.

After managing showrooms and staff for Mercedes-Benz, Lexus, and other luxury automobile brands; joining Reinert Fine Art has been a natural fit. Roger Dale Brown OPAM grew up in Tennessee, exploring the woods, creeks, and fields around his Nashville home. He has made it his life's work to connect deeply to places around the world, incorporating knowledge of their nature, history, architecture, and culture in his creative process, and reflecting that knowledge in his painting and writing. Roger has developed his own style, which draws deeply from the Impressionist view that painting from life is essential. This determination and dedication have culminated in his receiving Master Status with three top painting organizations in one year.

Nancy S. Crookston OPAM's talent for drawing developed at a young age and has always played a significant part in her life. After years of university classes and workshops, Nancy discovered the great Russian master colorist, Sergei Bongart and she credits her formal training with Bongart with elevating her career. Nancy is most known for her figurative oil paintings which show her mastery of true color and the human body, and her charcoal and pen and ink sketches have been recognized by an international audience. She has been featured in numerous magazines and consistently wins top awards with OPA and other national art organizations.

Calvin Liang OPAM Calvin Liang was born in Canton, China. He began painting in high school and completed his art education at the Shanghai Academy of Fine Arts, recognized as one of China's most prestigious and competitive art academies. In China, his skills as a fine artist were applied to the theatrical industry where he designed and created sets for operas and musical dramas for the Canton Opera Institute. Liang moved to the United States in 1987 and continued his profession as a full-time artist. He had a long and successful career creating visual art for the entertainment industry in animation. His accomplishments include winning several top awards in important exhibitions and being published in multiple international art magazines. Calvin is a Master Signature Member in several leading art organizations.

William A. Schneider OPAM was trained at the American Academy of Art. He pursued the Academy's Saturday Program for eight years, studying life drawing with Bill Parks, and painting with Ted Smuskiewicz. Workshops with Carolyn Anderson, Dan Gerhartz OPAM, Harley Brown OPAM, Richard Schmid, and others solidified his understanding of the basics. But he credits the many hours he spent studying and copying masterworks by Nicolai Fechin with refining his approach to edges. He describes four days of intense study and analysis of the works of J.W. Waterhouse at the Musee des beaux-arts in Montreal as an epiphany in his understanding of composition. Bill has been designated a Master Signature Member in several leading oil and pastel art organizations

Mary Qian OPAM received a BFA from the highly regarded art program at Brigham Young University. After a brief stint working in 3D graphics, Mary took the leap to paint full-time and has never looked back. She is OPA's 2010 Gold Medal National Exhibition recipient, as well as the 2009 winner of the prestigious Dorothy Mellin Driehaus Fellowship Award for Midwestern Artists. Mary can often be found painting or drawing at Chicago's iconic Palette & Chisel. Her true joy is painting people and she hopes that her painting demonstration will convey that emotion to her audience.

Painting Demonstration with Wet Paint Juror of Awards Christopher Zhang OPAM Location: Founders Hall

Born in Shanghai, China, Christopher acquired a BFA degree in China and an MFA in the United States. In addition to creating subject matter paintings, he specializes in portraiture and landscapes. His versatile styles and skills in still life and in Chinese traditional painting and calligraphy have also won popularity. Although his primary painting medium is oil, he also enjoys working in watercolor, acrylic, gouache, and Chinese ink. His education in fine arts was strongly influenced by the Russian realistic painting of the 19th century and the Soviet times. The focus was always on life model drawing and painting, studying the combination of color contrast and dark and light values as

shown by different brushstrokes. Under professional gallery lighting, this kind of painting produced a realistic and vivid style but lacked delicacy and visual attraction. In addition, the subject matter painting, like other media, would often be used for political propaganda in China. Most of his paintings during that period are unfortunately gone.

Akhriev's drawings are in several books about the Repin Institute, both in Russian language and in Chinese, and in numerous magazines such as *Artists* Magazine, *Pastel Journal, Island Journal, Chattanooga Magazine, Southern Living, and American Art Collector*. Now a U.S. citizen, Daud shares a home base in Chattanooga, Tennessee, and Andalusia, Spain with his artist wife, Melissa Hefferlin.

Jill Basham's work is typically quiet, often with muted colors and purposefully simple design. She is dedicated to conveying the light, atmosphere, and "feeling" of the landscapes she paints and wants to evoke an emotional reaction. Some of Basham's more recent accomplishments include a 2022 Oil Painters of America Wet Paint Award from respected artist, Dave Santillanes OPA; "Best of Show", in Plein Air Easton (modified for 2020); "Best of Show" for her work at the Door County Plein Air Invitational by C.W. Mundy OPAM; and the "Judges Award" at Olmsted Plein Air for two different works by both Peter Trippi, editor-in-chief of Fine Art Connoisseur Magazine; and Kelly Kane, editor-in-chief of Plein Air Magazine.

Christine Lashley OPA is an American artist known for her colorful and dramatic oils. Her awards include the Bold Brush Award, Best of Show at Telluride Plein Air, Best of Show at Bath County Plein Air, ARC salon Plein Air award, and Best Landscape at the 27th Oil Painters of America's (OPA) National Exhibition. Publications include the cover and feature article in Plein Air Magazine. She has taught workshops and classes for over 20 years. With a BFA from Washington University in St. Louis and prior study at the Sorbonne and Parsons in Paris; Christine continued her art education with workshops from prominent artists including Scott Christensen, with whom she is currently doing an online Beyond the Easel Webinar series.

Kathie Odom OPA After graduating from The University of Tennessee in Art Education and Fine Arts, Kathie Odom OPA received early recognition for her pastel works. But it was in 2009, that she found her true passion in painting oils en plein air. Kathie considers herself a "Nostalgic Impressionist" as a way of identifying the subjects and style of painting that interests her most. In 2021, Kathie had a busy year that included winning the Artists Choice Award at The Forgotten Coast Plein Air Event, serving as OPA's Eastern Regional Juror of Awards, and gracing the cover of Artists Magazine and Southwest Art Magazine in the previous two years.

Steven S. Walker has been creating inspiring works of art for corporations and private collectors for over twenty years. He earned his bachelor's degree in fine arts at Virginia Commonwealth University and his master's in fine arts from Marywood University. As a full-time artist, Steven has been included in several local and national juried competitions including the Oil Painters of America Eastern Regional, Salon and National, Richeson 75 Landscape Competition, Plein Air Salon, the International Salon, and the Art Renewal Center. Steven also had the privilege of being part of a statewide traveling exhibition with the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts.
