

EASTERN REGIONAL EXHIBITION AN IMPRESSIVE EVENT

This year's Eastern Regional Show was held at Eisele Gallery of Fine Art located in Cincinnati, Ohio. Housed in a stately brick home dating back to the early 19th Century, Eisele Gallery continues to exude the charm and old world elegance of yesteryear. Needless to say, the exhibit was impressive and beautifully complemented the building's architectural and historic significance.

Artists in attendance were in for a terrific weekend of events including two highly anticipated painting demonstrations by well-known and respected artists Stephanie Birdsall and David Mueller. Ms. Birdsall started the weekend off on Friday afternoon with a still life demonstration. Birdsall received her formal training at London's prestigious City and Guilds of London Art School in England but she credits her association with the Putney painters, led by the incomparable Richard Schmid for much of her recent success.

A large number of artists attended the opening reception and awards ceremony on Friday evening where Juror of Awards and Master Signature artist Charles Cox announced the prize winners. The ever so talented Marci Oleszkiewicz OPA was

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awarded the Gold Medal in the Associate/Signature Division for her painting "Looking Back" and artist Marc Hanson OPAM won the Gold Medal in the Master Signature Division for his alluring painting "Silence".

Immediately following, OPA artists and their guests met for dinner at the historic National Exemplar, a local favorite in the quaint Village of Mariemont, just east of downtown Cincinnati. It was a great opportunity to network and a perfect way to end the day.

Saturday morning got off to a great start with an inspiring presentation by David Mueller on "The Building of a Great Design". Mueller, a talented artist and natural born teacher began with a slide show of history's most famous works of art that illustrated exceptional design elements. Later, he demonstrated how to go about creating a good design every time you paint.

The afternoon wrapped up with a visit to Cincinnati's Taft Museum. This is one of the finest small art museums in the country and is home to a wonderful collection of representational art, including works by Rembrandt, Reynolds, Turner, Whistler and Sargent.

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

JUROR OF AWARDS STATEMENT By Charles Cox OPAM



The 2016 OPA Eastern Regional was held at Eisele Gallery in Cincinnati. Lodging was at the charming and beautiful Premier Best Western in the Village of Mariemont and a wonderful time was had by the attendees!

My job as judge was to select winners from the hundred or so excellent works of art which were picked by the online judges from more than 1000 entries. This was a very difficult job which I worked at for some 4-5 hours before settling on my picks. These prize winners represent diverse types of representational art from loose and spontaneous to more carefully worked out and they ran the gamut of subject matter. In the end I was very pleased with my selections and was glad to hear that others thought I had done a good job.

My first encounter with each winning piece produced a positive reaction which I then analyzed as to color, composition, drawing, brushwork, edges, etc. Some paintings I thought had a certain mystique or mood. Some were unique. Others were more conventional and perhaps contained more academic skills, but at a high level. Some were bright in chroma but still harmonious, others were more subdued, but might have contained beautiful tonal relationships. Still others had economy of execution. I remember one selection that was charged with vapor, atmosphere and light. One had translucent color, invented as much as observed. Some showed a great eye for pattern. Several had luscious color and painterliness. All had many subtle nuances of color and tone.

So I toured the room for hours, actually working up a sweat in this air-conditioned gallery, making an intense effort to "get it right", knowing that in the end a certain amount of subjectivity was unavoidable, but satisfied that I had done my job with absolute integrity. I very much enjoyed my experience, from meeting interesting and lively people from different parts of the country to seeing the excitement and joy on the faces of some of the award recipients. So I thank you for allowing me to be your judge and I hope your experience was as good as mine.

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MEET THE ASSOCIATE & SIGNATURE GOLD MEDAL WINNER MARCI OLESZKIEWICZ OPA

Marci Oleszkiewicz, grew up in the city of Chicago in a family of four. Her mother homeschooled all four children where each child's gifts were nurtured and encouraged. Marci's father was a carpenter and there wasn't a moment in childhood that he was not renovating or working on some project for their home. Looking back Marci attributes much of her creativity to seeing her father always working on something, creating something out of nothing. "My dad would say 'see Marci if you work at something little by little you will see your idea come about.' Seeing my Dad's work ethic and learning from my Mom the value of self discipline as a home schooler, I believe gave me some of the foundational tools I would need later in life to succeed as an artist."



Marci's passion for art was inspired at a young age. As a child, she remembers sitting at her little desk making pictures. "It seemed I often communicated visually. I remember imagining my little creations coming alive as I made final touches."

Although she has been studying art and painting for some time, it was in 2007 when things started to move forward and she began to see what the future might hold for her. Upon entering several art competitions Marci was not only accepted into two of the top shows, but also received very substantial awards from both. Not long after, she was included in Southwest Art Magazine's "21 Under 31" and had her first two man show at Gallery Russia in Scottsdale, AZ. "Receiving so many incredible honors really encouraged and pushed me into becoming a full time painter." Since then Marci has continued to paint full time. "I am always so encouraged to hear the response from my collectors every year, how they connect and are so touched by what I paint. It is my goal as an artist to create works that resonate with the hearts of others, to speak clearly and deeply to the innermost being. To capture moments of life on canvas that convey all of life's beauty and wonder, joy and sorrow, love and truth. I've heard it said if you paint from your heart you will speak to the hearts of your viewers, and that is my desire. "The Lord has blessed me with this passion for art and I am delighted to be able to share what I see with my students and collectors to show them the beauty and love that surrounds them."

Marc Hanson OPAM began college as a biology major, but soon applied to and was accepted into Art Center College of Design in Pasadena, CA, majoring in illustration. After Art Center and a brief stint as a staff illustrator in Sacramento, CA, he moved to Minnesota where he lived for 33 years while raising a family and


pursuing his art. Marc recently relocated to the hills, woods and swamps of northern Mississippi where he is pursuing his subject in earnest.

He was selected as a Finalist in the *International Artist's Magazine's* Art Prize Challenge and in 2011 was awarded the Bronze Medal for his entry in the OPA National Exhibition.


