

QUIET AMBIANCE THE HALLMARK OF THE 2015 EASTERN REGIONAL SHOW

The City of Indianapolis is made up of a diversity of areas. None could be more quaint and inviting than the neighborhood in which the 2015 Eastern Regional Exhibition was held, the historic Butler-Tarkington section. Not only was the area attractive, but so was the host gallery, Eckert & Ross Fine Art. From the moment we walked in the door we felt welcomed by the staff and co-owner Jim Ross. Housed on two levels, paintings flowed from the first floor, down the staircase to the lower level, with all paintings being displayed for well lit and easy viewing.

Weekend activities began with a portraiture demonstration on Friday morning by William Schneider OPA. Bill's model was Kristina Beligratis, daughter of Executive Director Kathryn Beligratis, who has, according to Schneider, the classic features of a J.W. Waterhouse (of the Pre-Raphaelite movement) model. It was inspiring to watch Bill transform a blank canvas into a beautiful likeness of the model, in only two and a half hours. At one point Bill commented that an artist should know when to stop painting. This seemed to indicate that he was done, but not so. He continued, enhancing his portrait to a greater degree.

Following the painting demo members and guests travelled to the Indianapolis Museum of Art for lunch, followed by an enlightening tour of the museum. Marty Krause, Museum Curator,

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lead visitors through the museum, specifically calling attention to, and giving background of, the art work of Indiana artists such as T. C. Steele and William Forsyth. Many stayed after Mr. Krause's tour to further explore the museum.

The opening reception was held at the gallery on Friday evening to a standing room only crowd who were offered desserts that could not be beat. Ken Cadwallader OPA and Executive Director Kathryn Beligratis welcomed everyone, after which Juror of Awards, David Hettinger OPAM announced his award winning decisions. Hettinger noted the nuances he found in Terry Rafferty's "Stargazers", which made him award this painting the Gold Medal in the Associate and Signature Division. He also called attention to "Chamisa", the countryside painting by Albert Handell OPAM to which he awarded the Gold Medal in the Master Signature Division.

On Saturday morning members and guests returned to the gallery for a painting demonstration by Juror of Awards David Hettinger OPAM. Hettinger began by giving a background of his life and described how he currently teaches a class. Though Hettinger OPAM is








JUROR OF AWARDS STATEMENT By David Hettinger OPAM

OPA's Eastern Regional Exhibition was held at Eckert and Ross Fine Art in Indianapolis, Indiana. Eckert and Ross did a wonderful job of hanging the exhibition. The artwork was outstanding, presenting me, as juror, a real challenge.

For the first hour I simply enjoyed the work, every piece was a winner. Then came the challenge of deciding which pieces would be awarded the ribbons. As a juror I have my guidelines that include the elements of design, composition, use of medium and color harmony. To these elements

I add my own feelings: which piece made me think, which made me smile and which pieces told me a bit about who the artists themselves are. Some spoke to me on several levels, while others simply said "this is by a master" and there were plenty of masters in the show. Though there were only a few *actual* Master Signature members in the show, every painting in this year's Eastern Regional show was done by a master artist, in my book. Congratulations to all those who made it into this year's OPA exhibition.

SHIRL SMITHSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP WINNER RECOUNTS HIS WORKSHOP EXPERIENCE

Thanks to a generous grant from the Oil Painters of America Shirl Smithson Memorial Scholarship Fund, I recently had the opportunity to study with Colleen Barry at the Grand Central Atelier in Long Island City, NY.

I have long admired Colleen's work and wanted to learn the secrets to her exquisitely rendered drawings, so I jumped at the chance to take a 3-day portrait drawing workshop with her. The workshop proved to be just what I was looking for. Arriving at GCA, I wended my way through the labyrinth of rooms to the workshop studio and proceeded to spend three full days learning to render a magnificent model, Andre, with simple pencil on paper. The secret seemed to be right in front of my eyes: I needed to slow down, and then slow down some more, look, and then look harder, see, and then see better. The result was my best drawing to date and a great sense of satisfaction.

And my good fortune continued as, immediately following Colleen's workshop, I stayed on for another three days, this time portrait-painting with Ted Minoff and Patrick Byrnes, two superb painters whose work I have also admired greatly. Having just learned my stopand-see lessons with Colleen, I was immediately able to apply those lessons to my paintings and voila! It worked again.

So thank you again, OPA; my art is better for the opportunity.





Derek Penix was born in 1980 in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Penix grew up watching members of his family paint but didn't pursue painting until after high school. After trying his hand at painting and selling his first piece he knew this was what he wanted to do for the rest of his life.

Over the years Penix's work has changed greatly and continues to evolve with each painting. "I never want to be stuck painting only one way or only one subject matter. Variety is the spice of life and is especially that way for me with painting."



Penix has had the opportunity to work under Quang Ho OPAM and later with C.W. Mundy OPAM. "They have helped me immensely as an artist. I am so thankful that they have been willing to feed into my life as they have."

Penix has been recognized in many national competitions and publications. Even at a young age Penix was recognized in *South West Art Magazine's* "21 Under 31" in 2010 and *Oklahoma Magazine's* "40 Under 40" in 2014.

Elizabeth Pollie's exposure to the arts came at an early age. Taken to museums, enrolled in classes by her parents and influenced by her father's love and practice of art and architecture, she was always clear about her path in life.
