Wednesday afternoon and continued into Thursday with the "Best Little Plein Air Competition in Texas". Artists were offered the opportunity to plein air paint throughout the City of Dallas on Wednesday with many taking the bus to Winfrey Point at White Rock Lake Park and the Dallas Arboretum for painting on Thursday. As in past years, Southwest Art Magazine sponsored their awesome "Pampered Paint Out" as part of this event. Good food, a fantastic masseuse and musical entertainment made for an enjoyable day of painting. A number of spectacular works were created during these two days, many of which were entered in the plein air competition. The day wound down with a poolside welcome reception where members and guests mingled.

On Friday morning Signature Member Qiang Huang presented a still life painting demonstration at the Crowne Plaza Dallas, offering artists the opportunity to visit vendors during a break from his demo. In the afternoon Distinguished Artist Jeff Legg OPAM was interviewed by Signature member John Pototschnik. Attendees got to know

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by John Pototschnik OPA. Collectors from all walks of life gathered and discussed their insights into collecting works in this ever changing economy.

Southwest Gallery was packed, with standing room only, during the opening reception, held Friday evening. Members and guests walked throughout the gallery to view almost 250 Associate, Signature and Master Signature painters' works while enjoying wine and appetizers. This was followed by the Awards and Recognition Ceremony at the Crowne Plaza Dallas Galleria. At this event new Signature and Master Signature members were recognized and Past OPA President Neil Patterson OPAM was presented the Golden Brush Award for his many years of hard work and meritorious service to OPA. The raffle basket winners were also chosen at this time, all of which was leading up to the most important part of the evening, the announcement of the award winners by Juror of Awards Kevin Macpherson OPAM. The Gold Medal Award in the Master Signature Division went to Huihan Liu OPAM for "At Mt. Tangulla Pass, Northern Tibet" and the Gold Medal Award in the Associate and Signature Division was given to Derek W. Penix for "Spade Fish". Saturday morning started off with a breakfast sponsored by Dick Blick/ Utrecht and a very interesting presentation by Joe Gyurcsak on the "Successful Elements of Design in Painting". Many essentials of design were discussed which lead members to comment that this was one of the most insightful presentations they had heard in years. Later in the morning Juror of Awards Kevin Macpherson OPAM demonstrated his artistic skills while sharing his expertise in transforming a blank canvas into a work of art. After lunch attendees watched 5 talented artists paint and offer evidence that even having only 2 hours to paint can be enough to create something to be appreciated. For interest, 3 artists painted the same model, showing different interpretations of the same subject.

American Art Collector Magazine once again hosted a stupendous dinner event, this year at the Iron Cactus



JUROR OF AWARDS STATEMENT By Kevin Macpherson OPAM

I have had the honor to be a juror for many art exhibitions and competitions. I take this responsibility seriously. I know from my own experience that artists work hard to the best of our ability and we are very attached emotionally to our product. As a judge, it is important to take ample time, so that respect is given to each piece being displayed for review.

The vast variety of subjects and styles makes the job of jurying all that more challenging. It is not easy to compare boats to children, flowers to cathedrals. There may be subjects that I just don't like but I need to put my prejudices aside. Again, this is not easy but that is my job as a respected juror.

Some artworks, bold and colorful, can grab our attention quickly but the connection also quickly fades. Other works subtle, delicate or quiet may grow on us in time. While viewing the art in the exhibition gallery there is a lot of visual distraction



looking at hundreds of works stacked floor to ceiling. It is not easy to give each their due. It is best to visit the work over many hours and break during the day. I like to clear my head from the visual overload to see it all fresh again. My particular mood of the moment can slant my perspective. The location of a work displayed can give it an advantage or disadvantage. I often rearrange the work as I make my decisions. The gallery was very cooperative to help me see many paintings in a new light, so to speak. This is my reputation and my stamp of approval, so I do what is necessary for the fairest assessment.

I look at the work wearing two hats. The first is the objective hat. Here we can compare work on relatively equal footing. The second phase of my examination I wear the subjective hat. Both are so important but when it gets down to the wire the subjective response examines the intangible ingredient that gives one the unexplainable goose bumps when in the presence of a masterpiece.

There are fundamentals: line, focal point, color, shapes, value, edges, perspective, composition, light, balance and harmony that underlie any subject. This technical expertise is the more objective consideration. I pay particular attention to how the work is made technically. Does the work feel personal or expected or have I seen this so many times before? Do I see too much influence from past artists or instructors? All these, and many more, questions go through my mind for each painting.

Judging the technical, the objective hat, I need to examine and decide if the artist is deliberately distorting or exaggerating drawing or color to add drama to enhance the idea or emotion, or is it lack of skill? I appreciate the craft, the knowledge of the fundamentals, tools and techniques to communicate the idea at the highest level.

So many submissions are mere pictures, not compositions, and if technically flawless often without feeling. Some paintings have the power to uplift, offering a deeper visual experience beyond a mere picture. The painter's visual language, technical expertise, uniqueness and qualities that set a painting apart from the pack will rise to the top.

I spend time with each artwork to find their deeper meaning. Change hats for the subjective considerations. How did the artist interpret the subject? Great paintings are challenging for the artists and should challenge the viewer to be engaged emotionally beyond the mere academics. This is the "X" factor that separates the good from the great.

I try to be open to all subjects, techniques, styles, representational or abstract, impressionist, expressionistic or highly realistic. I try to be honest and fair but I am human so there are always flaws in the system. Celebrate your successes and forgive your failings. In the hands of another juror there would be a very different outcome.

Derek Penix was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma and grew up watching members of his family paint but didn't pursue painting himself until after high school. After trying his hand at painting and selling his first piece he knew this was what he wanted to do for the rest of his life.

Over the years Penix's work has changed greatly and continues to evolve with each painting. "I never want to be stuck painting only one way or only one subject matter. Variety is the spice of life and is especially that way for me with painting."

Penix has had the opportunity to work under Quang Ho OPAM and later with C.W. Mundy OPAM. "They have helped me immensely as an artist. I am so thankful that they have been willing to feed into my life as they have."

Penix has been recognized in many national competitions and publications. Even at a young age Penix was recognized in *South West Art* Magazine's "21 Under 31" in 2010 and *Oklahoma Magazine's* "40 Under 40" in 2014. In the Jan/Feb, 2016 he was noted in *Fine Art Connoisseur* in the article "Three to Watch".

MEET THE MASTER SIGNATURE DIVISION GOLD MEDAL WINNER HUIHAN LIU OPAM

Huihan Liu OPAM was born in 1952 in Guangzhou, China where he attended school and graduated from Guangzhou Academy of Fine Art in 1975. He then taught in the Art School of Guangzhou Academy of Fine Art after which he was accepted into their Graduate School. Huihan came to the United States to further his studies and graduated from the Academy of Art College in San Francisco with an M.F.A. followed by teaching at the Academy. He is a Graduate School Adviser at the Academy of Art University.

When in China, he participated in many exhibitions both on a regional and national level. Since moving to the United States, he has continued to participate in many national painting shows and invitational exhibitions. His paintings have won many awards and have been collected by both private collectors and museums. In 2012, Huihan's painting "Spring of Miao Village" was selected by the Organization committee for the

Olympic Fine Arts and was exhibited during the 30th Olympic Games in London. Huihan conducts a few invitational painting workshops both in the United States and abroad. Huihan and his wife Liang Weizhen are both full time painters who live in the Bay Area of San Francisco. They both love to travel and have made many trips to Tibet, France, Italy, and Taiwan for their painting subjects.

Huihan is an Artist Member of Guangdong Artists' Association China, Master Signature Member of Oil Painters of America, Master Member of American Impressionist Society, an Artist Signature Member of California Art Club, School of Art & Design Guangzhou University Professor in China.





MEET THE DOROTHY DRIEHAUS MELLIN FELLOWSHIP FOR MIDWESTERN ARTISTS WINNER ELIZABETH POLLIE OPA

"A successful representational painting transcends technique and gimmickry, eliciting from the viewer a sense of connection with the truer nature of the subject. In the best of these works we are taken, almost unwittingly, into the heart of the painting. Here we feel, down to the bone, the more intrinsic qualities of a scene_be they lovely or disturbing, either way we are mesmerized. If we are very lucky our own hearts are broken open".

Elizabeth grew up visiting museums, studying and drawing alongside her father. She earned her BFA from The College for Creative Studies, Detroit, MI, where she later taught. Her interests led her into the field of editorial illustration. The 1980's were rich with greatly imaginative artists who honed both their conceptual and representational skills in the world of illustration. Ms. Pollie's work was nationally published and awarded.

As illustration began to fade from magazines and book jackets her focus upon representational painting became central. Pollie's work has received a very strong reception in

the art world, collecting numerous awards as well as extensive media coverage.

Her emphasis is based on finding and teasing out a sense of poetry, mood and depth. From capturing the authentic nature of animals to broad expanses of water and land, Pollie's work has a quality of sincerity woven into it. Mystery, solitude and intimacy comingle to create a palpable experience. "The intrigue and intimacy found in observing the surrounding world provides me with ceaseless inspiration. There is a great sense of freedom as well as a spirit of discovery that is derived through the act of painting." says Pollie.

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



MEET THE SPRING, 2016 ONLINE SHOWCASE WINNER CHARLES IARROBINO

Born in Annapolis, Maryland in 1952, Charles studied painting and printmaking at Virginia Commonwealth University and Syracuse University, graduating with a BFA in Painting and Printmaking in 1974. A member of Oil Painters of America and the American Impressionist Society, he has had numerous one-man shows on the East Coast as well as in his adopted state of New Mexico.

A lifelong fascination with color expressed itself initially in abstract painting, but since moving to northern New Mexico the brilliant high desert light dictated a change in the direction of his painting. Years of attempting to capture aspects of that light resulted in an artistic output dominated by landscapes, street scenes and gardens. In the past two



Living in New Mexico has provided something of a "continuing education experience" owing to the lessons taught daily not only by the radiant light but through the cross-pollinating conversations regarding technique and aesthetics that are inevitable in an area teeming with painters. Influenced early on by the Impressionists, Iarrobino was later to find inspiration (as have so many others) in the masterworks of John Singer Sargent, Joaquin Sorolla and Anders Zorn. He owes an additional debt of gratitude to 20th century masters Henri Matisse and Richard Diebenkorn as well as contemporary luminaries such as Quang Ho OPAM, Dan McCaw, Jon Redmond, Terry Miura and Ben Aronson - and others too numerous to list.


