

#### PICTURESOUE SAINT SIMONS ISLAND HOSTS THE 2017 EASTERN EXHIBITION

Picturesque, tranquil Saint Simons Island was the location of the 2017 Eastern Regional Exhibition. The inviting and warm Mary Anderson Fine Art Gallery exhibited over 100 of the finest eastern Associate and Signature members' paintings, as well as about 25 Master Signature works.

Activities began on Wednesday afternoon when some 45 artists began painting canvasses to enter in the plein air competition and wet paint sale, held in conjunction with, but separate from, the Eastern Regional Exhibition. Artists toured the area to find scenes to paint, including such things as the historic lighthouse,

Wesley Memorial Gardens, and beautiful 600-acre Musgrove Plantation on the banks of the Village Creek. Thursday was also devoted to plein air painting but wound down with members and guests eating at one of several of the well-known, local restaurants.

On Friday morning, Master Signature Member Marc Hanson presented a demonstration at the Artist's Annex Gallery, around the corner from Anderson Fine Art Gallery. Marc's painting was done with oil sticks, a new form of oil painting for a number of painters in the audience. He explained why he had chosen to use this medium and how it differed from painting with the more traditional tubes of oil. His resulting landscape proved that expanding ones horizons may open up a new world of oil painting to those willing to try something different. After lunch, at Tramici Restaurant, artists turned in there

plein air paintings for judging and awards to be announced later.

Friday evening began with an Opening Reception at the Anderson Fine Art Gallery with lively entertainment and refreshments on the patio behind the Gallery. The high point of the evening was the announcement of awards by Juror of Awards Howard Friedland OPAM. Dan Beck OPA's beautiful painting "Bella" won the Gold Medal in the Associate and Signature Division, while Shizhong Yan OPAM won the Gold Medal in the Master Signature Division for his striking entry "Drinking Milk Tea".

Howard Friedland OPAM began Saturday morning by offering a painting demonstration at the Sea Palms Resort. Taking into account the location of the eastern show, Howard offered his rendition of a dry docked boat. His explanation of his use of colors gave insight into how he developed a most striking painting.

After a lunch break, Katie Dobson Cundiff OPA presented a demonstration on painting a water scene. Katie spent extensive time telling how she develops an idea for a painting before putting her first brushstroke on the canvas. Hearing her tell of her thought and development process was quite enlightening.

Saturday evening offered a second reception, this time for the Plein Air Competition. Held at the Artists' Annex Gallery, Marc Hanson OPAM chose Mary O. Smith's painting "Musgrove Maze" as the First Place Winner. Noted news commentator Bob Schieffer was one of the guests at this enjoyable event. Afterwards, many returned to the Sea Palms Resort for dinner followed by a late night evening on the patio.

Anderson Fine Art Gallery invited

everyone to a "Thanks for Coming" breakfast on Sunday morning at the Artist's Gallery Annex. Following Artist Focus section of American the breakfast, Master Signature Art Collector Magazine - valued at Member John Michael Carter presented a demonstration on how he creates one of his masterful portraits, for which he is so well known.

All in all, the five day event was a pleasant experience with beautiful scenery, moderate temperatures and a lovely gallery as host to the exhibition.



#### JUROR OF AWARDS STATEMENT HOWARD FRIEDLAND OPAM

Being asked to judge an art show is a great honor, but it is also a great responsibility. To be an artist is to be sensitive. We wear our hearts on our sleeves when we put our work up for judging. It is said that we must develop a thick skin to the opinions of others, but aren't we thrilled when our work is accepted into a show or we get a prestigious award? Isn't the opposite also true if our work is not selected or it is passed over for an award?

Before I arrived at the Anderson Fine Art Gallery to judge the show, I checked out the exhibit online several times. I was sure that I knew how I would pick the award winners. However, when I walked in the gallery door and saw the framed paintings in person I realized that selecting the awards wasn't going to be so easy!



As I examined the artwork, several of the paintings that I hadn't considered before kept calling me back again and again. I spent the entire day mulling over and over my choices. In the end, the thing that made the difference was how the artist used his or her materials to express the mood and feeling of their subject. The paint application, brushstrokes, composition, light, etc. certainly played an important role. There were many, many great paintings that had these qualities, but unfortunately there were just so many awards.

One thing I am sure of, you may have chosen an entirely different group of paintings for awards, but the quality of these award winners can't be denied.

My advice to OPA Members is "go for the gusto" if you don't enter the show, you can't win the award. Every judge likes a different type of painting. Yours just might have "the right stuff"! As Nike says "Just do it"!





#### MEET THE EASTERN SHOW ASSOCIATE AND SIGNATURE DIVISION GOLD MEDAL WINNER DAN BECK OPA

Wanderlust was Dan's primary motivation in the decade following his graduation from high school. Dan took to the road, working jobs that included ranch hand in Arizona, construction worker on the beach of Florida, furniture refinisher in Louisiana and four years in the infantry, including a two year tour in Germany. Wherever he went, Dan filled sketch books and journals for his own enjoyment. Then in Colorado after a couple of years in college, he realized that the things that meant most to him were his sketch books. So, he quit his job and college, sold everything he had and decided that commitment to one path was where all the previous had led him.

Dan has studied at the Art Student League of Denver, with numerous contemporary painters and has continuously studied the impressionist masters. Equally adept at figurative, still-life and landscape, Dan is an experimenter by nature, as well as being firmly rooted in the tradition of Impressionism. His love of nature and a deep respect for the tradition of art serve as both guide and inspiration to his goal of "making a contribution" to the world of painting. Dan's paintings evoke a timelessness and dignity that are the underlying themes in whatever he paints. "Painting is a balancing act between opposite ideas - direct observation and instinct, control and spontaneity, even between the literal and the symbolic. It seems to me that although a painter is deeply involved with his own private investigation, his real aim is to communicate something to the viewer that resonates on a uniquely personal level."

In 2016, he received major awards in the Oil Painters of America National Exhibition, American Impressionist Society National Exhibition and Oil Painters of America Eastern Reginal Exhibition. He has also won numerous other OPA awards, including being the Gold Medal winner of the 2011 National Exhibition. Dan has similarly won awards from other major organizations and has had feature articles in various magazines, such as *American Art Collector, Southwest Art, American Artist, Art of the West, Artists on Art, Cape Fear Living* and *Art Talk.* His paintings have appeared on the covers of *Southwest Art* and *Art of the West.* Dan has participated in many nationally prominent shows and has exhibited his work in many galleries across the country. His paintings have found collectors in both the private and corporate world as well as in such diverse places as Canada, Japan and the Middle East. His work is in the permanent collection of the Littleton Historical Museum and he has exhibited with the Phippen Museum, Prescott, Arizona.

Dan lives in Wilmington, North Carolina with his wife and two daughters.

#### MEET THE EASTERN SHOW MASTER SIGNATURE DIVISION GOLD MEDAL WINNER SHIZHONG YAN OPAM

Shizhong Yan was born and raised in the coastal city of Qingdao, China. Influenced by his father, who was an architect, Shizhong fell in love with art at a young age. He studied under various well-known local artists and at the age of sixteen he was accepted by Central Academy of Fine Arts Affiliated School, often referred to as the cradle of fine artists, where he studied for four years. When the culture revolution swept China, Shizhong never gave up on his artistic dream. He was exiled and worked at manual labor in the country-side, but still took every minute he could to paint the world around him. When the cultural revolution ended, he was one of the first students accepted by China Academy of Fine Arts' graduate program. He continued his study under one of the most well-known artists



in China, Mr. Quan Shanshi. Shizhong studied in-depth the styles and techniques of Russian and European as well as American Impressionist masters, and was influenced by artists like Fechin, Degas, Cezanne, Sargent, etc.

In 1998, Shizhong and his family moved to United States, where he began a new chapter of his life, as well as artistic career. Shizhong now resides in Illinois. He has four collections of artworks published, and has been published by countless magazines and newspapers. Shizhong has had many solo and group exhibitions in China, United States, Japan, France, Australia, Canada, Taiwan and Hong Kong. He has received many awards and his paintings are collected and loved by collectors all over the world.

Craig Tennant OPAM, grew up in New Jersey and began his early art training in 1967 with Grey Advertising in New York. Starting in the mat room, he quickly moved up and then was made the Assistant Art Director for the Kool-Aid account. He later joined the staff of illustrators at BBD&O working on major accounts including Campbell's Soup and Dodge Chrysler for national television ads. His magazine ad accounts consisted of Tarreyton, GE, Shaffer, and Pepsi

(Generation). For the next twenty years, Craig illustrated on a freelance basis for clients including TV Guide, Field & Stream, Diet Coke, and IBM to name just a few. He was elected a member of the New York Society of Illustrators in 1980 and received their Silver Medal Award in 1981. In 1989, Craig moved to Colorado to focus on western oil paintings. He started his own publishing business, Cheyenne Press, to promote his work and was voted 21st in the nation's top print artists (by a U.S. Art Magazine survey of over 850 galleries nationwide). In 1996, he was commissioned by the Park Meadows Shopping Resort to paint a Colorado scene for the Nordstrom entrance. His work has appeared on the covers of many well known magazines. He has been the subject of additional feature articles in numerous periodicals. Four of his Native American paintings are shown in Crabtree Publishing's Native Nations of North America series of children's books published in 2001.

## MEET THE ASSOCIATE ONLINE SHOWCASE WINNER DEREK PENIX

Derek Penix was born on December 29, 1980 in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Penix grew up watching members of his family paint but didn't pursue painting himself until after high school. After trying his hand at painting and selling his first piece he knew this was what he wanted to do for the rest of his life.

Over the years Penix's work has changed greatly and continues to evolve with each painting. "I never want to be stuck painting only one way or only one subject matter. Variety is the spice of life and is especially that way for me with painting."

Penix has had the opportunity to work under Quang Ho OPAM and later with C.W. Mundy OPAM. "They have helped me as an artist immensely. I am so thankful that they have been willing to feed into my life as they have."

Penix has been recognized in many national competitions and publications. Even at a young age Penix was recognized in *Southwest Art Magazine's* "21 Under 31" artist competition in 2010, and *Oklahoma Magazine's* "40 Under 40" in 2014. To date, Penix's most notable and recent award has been the 2016 "Gold Medal Award" from Oil Painters of America 25th National Juried Exhibition, boasting a \$30,000 prize. Penix currently lives in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Penix has won numerous honors and awards from such organizations as OPA, Boldbush and RayMar as well as recently having received the Best Of Show in The Gateway International Painting Competition and Boldbrush Best of Show. He has also been recognized in such magazines as *Fine Art Connoisseur, American Art Collector, Southwest Art* and *The Artist Magazine*.

## MEET THE SIGNATURE ONLINE SHOWCASE WINNER ELIZABETH POLLIE OPA

Elizabeth Pollie's *personal* art history extends back decades. Art as a path, a language and a personal frontier has been present from the time of her childhood. Her parents exposed her to the arts as a child and encouraged her to follow her interests. She earned her BFA from The College For Creative Studies where she later taught.

Her interests led her into the field of editorial illustration. The 1980's were rich with greatly imaginative artists who helped her hone both her conceptual and representational skills in the world of illustration. Ms. Pollie's work was nationally published and awarded. As illustration began to fade from magazines and book jackets her focus upon representational painting became central.



#### In Elizabeth's words:

The intrigue and intimacy found in observing the surrounding world provides me with ceaseless inspiration. There is a great sense of freedom as well as a spirit of discovery that is derived through the act of painting. My emphasis is based on finding and teasing out a sense of poetry, mood and depth. I want to believe that what binds humans as a species is an inward call to experience the sublime even in the most ordinary of things. Art is an outward expression of that desire.

Pollie's work has received a strong reception in the art world, collecting numerous awards as well as media coverage.

She lives and works in the waterside town of Harbor Springs, MI. along with her husband, three dogs and a steer named Egbert.

# OIL PAINTERS of AMERICA

March 19, 2018

#### Dear OPA Members:

As an organization representing artists, both women and men, of different races and ethnicities the OPA Board of Directors states that it is our policy to promote and encourage an environment of inclusivity, equality and fairness in all OPA-sponsored activities and events.

In light of current events in this country, and the heightened awareness of these issues, we feel it is important to outline our position.

We, the OPA Board of Directors, have endeavored to design a jury system for entry into OPA exhibitions which is as free from bias as possible. Our juries are composed of both women and men from our Master Signature and Signature divisions. Individual jurors are selected from different genres and styles of painting and are anonymous to one another so that one juror cannot influence another. In this way we try to ensure that selections for our exhibitions are based on the merit of the submitted painting and not on the identity or reputation of the individual artist.

The board also strives to create OPA events at which all its members may participate and feel welcome. At some of these events we design activities that offer opportunities for our less experienced members to learn from and work beside some of our more experienced Signature and Master Signature members. We expect our members to be cordial and respectful to one another and helpful in terms of sharing their ideas and artistic experiences with our membership. The OPA Board of Directors will not condone behavior that is racially biased, sexist in nature or any type of sexual harassment from members attending or participating in OPA events.

In order to be proactive in dealing with these issues, the Oil Painters of America has appointed a task force to create an effective anti-harassment policy that applies to all meetings and activities associated with the OPA. We hope that this will ensure that all our members and staff are free from all forms of discrimination, harassment, and retaliation within our organization. We also hope that it will set an example of good practice for all artists and the organizations they work with.

## NATIONAL WET PAINT WINNERS WIN TWICE

In case you missed this, or have forgotten of the many reasons to enter the Wet Paint Competition at the National Convention, the 2 following should be noted. Not only are the cash and merchandise awards for this event at least \$10,000 but ALSO, the first place winners in both the Plein Air and the Indoor Studio Competitions are automatically accepted in next year's National Exhibition.

#### ARTISTS' FELLOWSHIP INC.

If you are a professional artist and in need of financial support, or know of a professional artist in these circumstances, please contact the Artists' Fellowship Inc. This not-for profit organization has roots that date back to 1859, with the founding of the Helpful Aid Society. The Endowment aids over 50 professional artists annually to overcome medical emergencies, studio fires, natural disasters and deep economic hardship. It does not support grants for art supplies, projects, exhibitions or publications. For further information or assistance, visit: www.artistsfellowship.org.

#### **REFINED GUIDELINES**

In an effort to answer questions concerning show entries, the Board has established some definitive guidelines for submittals to exhibitions. The following are of specific note:

ACCEPTABLE SUBSTRATES: Flat substrates including: primed canvas or linen, stretched or on a panel, gesso board, acrylic gessoed dibond, aluminum, aluminum composite panel. Acrylic primer is acceptable. Oil primed paper is acceptable if adhered with archival adhesive to a proper archival substrate. Paintings should NOT require being placed under glass.

UNACCEPTABLE SUBSTRATES: Paintings on decorative copper and tooled aluminum, natural stone or on three-dimensional objects. A substrate containing any printed image or photograph is prohibited regardless of whether it is your own or someone else's image/photo-graph. Paintings should NOT require being placed under glass.

ACCEPTABLE MEDIUMS: Oil paints, alkyd resin, water soluble oils, oil sticks/bars. Metal leaf (i.e.: gold, silver, etc.) is acceptable if it doesn't comprise more than 20 percent of the visible surface.

UNACCEPTABLE MEDIUMS: Watercolor, acrylics, mixed media, Genesis paints, oil pastels.
